UC Davis Children's September Hospital Visit



On September 30th, five Team-Will members rode to UCD Children's Hospital in Sacramento to visit the with the young patients and their families. Activities in the play room ranged from word puzzles and coloring to magic tricks with Play Doh. For the children who couldn't get to the play room, Team Will members went to them handing out games, t-shirts, and wrist bands to smiling faces in exchange for signatures on jerseys. For one young hero who couldn't raise his arm, his mother traced his hand on a member's shirt and signed for him. Every signature, sign, or mark on a Team Will jersey has a story. In this case, a hand print spoke volumes.

Hospital visits are at the core of Team Will's mission. For new members, they are an opportunity to experience firsthand why we "Go the Distance". For all members, they remind us who we ride for and how that drives us to raise awareness of childhood cancer. The next hospital visit is scheduled for the afternoon of November 18th. Beginning in January, our goal is to schedule one visit per month. These visits typically take place on weekday afternoons, as this time works best for the hospitals, their staff, and the patients. Every effort will be made to set dates far enough in advance to allow members who would like to participate a chance to make arrangements to attend. Children Creating for Children



They say kindness is contagious. Team Will's is so contagious it has changed the way hundreds of children view serving others.

I am an elementary art teacher who learned of the Team Will organization and I asked how I could help. In 2010, my students created 300 handmade cards that the team could deliver to children's hospitals. My students were so inspired they asked what more we could do. This fall over 2,100 elementary students participated in a drawing contest to create a coloring book for childhood cancer charities. So far, the project has inspired the donation of 400 boxes of crayons for a local children's hospital, the creation of over 1,000 handmade cards and over \$300 in staff donations to the Foundation for Children with Cancer...and we haven't even started selling the coloring books yet! For each coloring book sold this year, an additional coloring book will be donated to a hospital and a dollar will be donated to charity. We're also planning a fundraiser celebration for the day Team Will passes through our community. My students can't wait to cheer on the Team Will riders!

But most importantly, thousands of children took to heart Team Will's message, so poignantly featured in the "Go the Distance" documentary: "It's not ok to just sit back and let things happen when you can make a difference." Clearly Team Will's legacy goes beyond the support they give children and families and the dollars they have raised for Childhood Cancer charities. Team Will has shown so many across the country how to use their talents to make a difference in the lives of others. For that, we are all extremely grateful. Wishing you a successful preparation for the 2012 ride! Keep on inspiring!
